The website on Municipal Services Authority's internet will be the centralized point of information related to ADA. Municipal Services Authority will use and maintain the website to provide required notices, complaint procedures, and in accordance with 508 accessibility standards.

Municipal Services Authority's internet site, (known as msajpa.org), is provided as a service to the public agencies we serve and those in the general public who visit the site. Unauthorized attempts to change or upload information on this site is prohibited.

New Content

- New content on any MSA website or web page will be posted in an accessible format.
- New documents linked to the website or webpage will be made accessible and where that is not possible, an alternative format or a subject matter contact person will be made available (which may be upon request).
- Comments or suggestions for additions to the website, such as printed material in alternative formats for people with various disabilities, may be submitted to the ADA Coordinator.
- Images and tables or charts that cannot be made readily accessible will have alternate text to provide descriptive information.

Current Content

- Municipal Services Authority will make every reasonable effort to remediate webpages and content currently on the website or webpages as time permits. Initially, the ADA Coordinator will be available to provide alternative formats or descriptive information for accessibility issues. Remediation work will be ongoing. For additional accessibility assistance contact the ADA Coordinator.

Training

- Employees receive role appropriate training in accessibility standards and the creation of accessible documents. Training is ongoing.
